



Agricultural Tests

Milk and dairy product/process waters – antibiotics, bacteria

Animal Health testing – brucellosis, EIA, mastitis, performance enhancing substances

Feed, seed and fertilizer testing – label guarantee analysis

Pesticide Analysis - label guarantee analysis, misuse investigations

Meat testing - label guarantee analysis

Industrial hemp testing – compliance monitoring



Environmental Tests

Water Quality Testing – nutrients, metals, wet chem, pesticides, bacteria Air Quality Testing – EPA regulated air toxics; carbonyls, heavy metals

Drinking Water Tests (new in 2020!)

Bacteria – public and private wells






Chapter 215: Agricultural Water Quality

Subchapter 1: General Provisions

§ 4801. Purpose; State policy

It is the purpose of this chapter to ensure that agricultural animal wastes do not enter the waters of this State. Therefore it is State policy that:

(1) All farms meet certain standards in the handling and disposal of animal wastes, as provided by this chapter, and the cost of meeting these standards shall not be borne by farmers only, but rather by all members of society, who are in fact the beneficiaries.




Farm Regulatory Thresholds




